A. Approve setting 2020-2021 school lunch prices

#### BACKGROUND

A. Section 205 of The Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 requires us to annually compare our district's average lunch prices with the federal reimbursement rate for free meals. This year the federal government's target lunch price is \$3.09 for the 2020-21 School Year. Our average lunch price for the 2019-20 school year was \$2.66. We are recommending closing this gap over several school years starting with a fifteen-cent increase for the 2020-21 school year. Below are what the paid lunch prices will be provided the recommendation us approved.
